Camp Counselor Program, 2019-2023

The U.S. Department of State BridgeUSA Camp Counselor program allows international participants —including university students, youth workers, teachers, and individuals with specialized skills—to temporarily work as counselors at American summer camps, gaining hands-on experience while immersing themselves in American culture. As camp counselors, participants lead activities and ensure a safe and enjoyable environment for campers, while also exposing campers and camp staff to other cultures. In 2023, a total of 28,622 camp counselors participated in the program across the U.S.³ Participants come to the U.S. on non-immigrant J-1 visas.






The Camp Counselor Program Advances American Interests

- Spread the word about the program and their experience in the U.S. with their networks via conversations, presentations, and social media




U.S. camps report that the program...

- Enables international camp counselors to develop a better understanding of the U.S.




The Camp Counselor Program Increases Mutual Understanding
